## (U) Worldwide Threat to Shipping (WTS) Report, 2– 30 October 2024

31 OCTOBER 2024

## (U) Executive Summary

#### (U) Scope

(U) The Worldwide Threat to Shipping (WTS) report provides information on threats to merchant vessels, the shipping industry, and other maritime stakeholders worldwide in the last 30 days. This report is produced primarily to inform merchant mariners and naval forces.

(U) Warnings, Advisories and Alerts: See Appendix C for active advisories.

#### (U) Summary:

- 1. (U) RED SEA: On 28 October, three attacks targeted a Liberia-flagged bulk carrier approximately 25 NM south of Mokha, Yemen.
- (U) INDONESIA: On 26 October, one perpetrator attempted to board a Singapore-flagged bulk carrier while underway in the eastbound lane of the Singapore Strait Traffic Separation Scheme (TSS).
- 3. (U) INDONESIA: On 25 October, four armed robbers boarded a bulk carrier while underway in the Singapore Strait.
- 4. (U) MEXICO: On 24 October, an unspecified number of robbers boarded a Mexico-flagged offshore supply vessel operating in the Bay of Campeche.
- 5. (U) PHILIPPINES: On 20 October, a robber armed with a handgun boarded a berthed product tanker during cargo operations at Mabini Sea Oil Terminal, Batangas.

## (U) Monthly Incidents by Region

(U) This section lists reports of active violence against shipping, credible threats to shipping, or the potential for a situation to develop into a direct threat to shipping over the past 30 days. Every effort is made to ensure that incidents are not double-counted. In the event that double-counting is detected, or an incident is later found to be different than initially reported, an explanation of the cancellation of the inaccurate report will be made in at least one message prior to dropping the erroneous report.

(U) MEXICO: On 24 October at 2000 local time, an unspecified number of robbers in a small fishing boat boarded a Mexico-flagged offshore supply vessel operating in the Bay of Campeche, near position 18:24N – 093:46W. Three of the robbers were armed with handguns and fired them into the air. Once onboard, they stole vessel equipment and crew valuables and reportedly transferred money out of crew members' savings accounts. Several crew members suffered slight injuries after being assaulted by the perpetrators. (Clearwater Dynamics)

- 2. (U) MEXICO: On 14 October at 2000 local time, four armed robbers boarded an offshore supply vessel operating near FPSO Miamte, approximately 5 NM northeast of Sanchez Magallanes in the Bay of Campeche, near position 18:22N 093:49W. The perpetrators boarded from a small fishing boat and stole crew belongings and ship's property, including self-contained breathing apparatuses. Following the incident, the crew was reported safe. Two other vessels also reported seeing the same small fishing boat in the area. (Clearwater Dynamics)
- 3. (U) MEXICO: On 6 October at 1915 local time, five armed robbers wearing masks boarded an offshore supply vessel while underway to Dos Bocas port in the Bay of Campeche, near position 18:30N 093:13W. The robbers stole mobile phones, laptops, portable radios, and breathing apparatuses and departed the vessel in a small boat. (Clearwater Dynamics)

- 1. (U) GHANA: On 18 October at 2219 local time, an unknown number of perpetrators boarded a bulk carrier anchored at Takoradi Anchorage, near position 04:52N 001:41W. The duty crew noticed movement by cargo hold number 1, raised the alarm, and the crew mustered. Following the raising of the alarm, the perpetrators escaped the vessel empty-handed. The ship reported the incident to port authorities and members of the coast guard boarded the vessel to investigate. (IMB; MDAT-GoG; Clearwater Dynamics)

- 1. (U) RED SEA: On 28 October, three attacks targeted the Liberia-flagged bulk carrier Motaro approximately 25 NM south of Mokha, Yemen, near position 12:53N 043:15E. The master reported three explosions in close proximity to the vessel between 1344 UTC and 1637 UTC. Following the attacks, no damage to the vessel was reported, all crew members were safe, and the vessel was proceeding to its next port of call. (UKMTO; Clearwater Dynamics; Maritime Executive; gCaptain; Joint Maritime Information Center)
- 2. (U) GULF OF ADEN: On 23 October at 0250 UTC, five small boats approached the China-flagged bulk carrier *Huan Hang 99* while underway approximately 48 NM south of Aden, Yemen (exact position not specified). One of the boats approached to within 0.3 NM of the vessel. The armed embarked security team fired warning shots to deter any further approach, and the boats departed the area. The master reported that the vessel and crew were safe following the incident. (UKMTO; Clearwater Dynamics; Joint Maritime Information Center)
- 3. (U) SOMALIA: On the evening of 22 October, a possible pirate action group consisting of 13 armed pirates launched from Ceel Huur near Hobyo, heading out toward the Indian Ocean. The pirates may be looking for ships to target. (IMB; Clearwater Dynamics)

- 4. (U) RED SEA: On 10 October, Huthi missiles targeted the Liberia-flagged product tanker Olympic Spirit while underway approximately 70 NM southwest of Hodeida, Yemen (exact position not specified). At 0010 UTC, an unknown projectile struck the vessel's bridge area on the starboard side. During a second attack at 0328 UTC, two more projectiles exploded in the water close to the tanker. The third attack occurred at approximately 0803 UTC, near position 14:28N 041:50E, when another projectile struck the water in close proximity to the vessel. All crew members were reported safe with no injuries. The vessel sustained minor damage during the initial attack but was still seaworthy and able to continue under its own power to its next port of call. 1. (U) INDONESIA: On 26 October at 2355 local time, one perpetrator attempted to board the Singapore-flagged bulk carrier AOM Bianca while underway in the eastbound lane of the Singapore Strait TSS, near position 01:08N – 103:45E. After the duty crew spotted the perpetrator attempting to board using a pole with a hook, the perpetrator jumped back into a small boat, which another person maneuvered away from the bulk carrier. The alarm was raised and the crew mustered to search for other unauthorized persons. The master later reported that all crew were safe and that nothing had been stolen. (Clearwater Dynamics; ReCAAP)

- 2. (U) INDONESIA: On 25 October at 0100 local time, four armed robbers boarded a bulk carrier while underway in the Singapore Strait, near position 01:08N 103:30E. The duty oiler discovered the perpetrators in the engine room and raised the alarm. After pointing their guns at the crew, the robbers escaped with engine spares. The master informed local authorities of the incident. (IMB; Clearwater Dynamics)
- 3. (U) PHILIPPINES: On 20 October at 0105 local time, a robber armed with a handgun boarded a berthed product tanker during cargo operations at Mabini Sea Oil Terminal, Batangas, near position 13:45N 120:57E. The crew spotted the perpetrator on the forecastle deck and raised the alarm. The robber pointed his handgun toward the crew and escaped. After the master informed Philippine authorities, the coast guard and police boarded the tanker and carried out a search. Ship's properties were reported stolen. (IMB; Clearwater Dynamics)
- 4. (U) INDONESIA: On 23 October at 0035 local time, six perpetrators armed with knives boarded a Kuwait-flagged crude oil tanker *Al Derwazah* while underway in the eastbound lane of the Singapore Strait TSS, near position 01:04N 103:41E. After the crew spotted the perpetrators in the engine room, the alarm was raised and the crew mustered. Aware of the crew's alertness, the perpetrators escaped. All crew members were safe and no injuries were reported. No items were reported stolen. The vessel did not require assistance and continued to its next port of call. (Clearwater Dynamics; ReCAAP)
- 5. (U) INDONESIA: On 18 October at 0233 local time, one unarmed perpetrator boarded the Malta-flagged bulk carrier *Maran Spirit* while underway in the eastbound lane of the Singapore Strait TSS, near position 01:05N 103:42E. After the crew spotted the perpetrator in the engine room, the alarm was raised and the crew mustered to conduct a search. No perpetrators were found and nothing was stolen. All crew members were safe and no injuries were reported. (ReCAAP; Clearwater Dynamics)
- 6. (U) INDONESIA: On 18 October at 0208 local time, 10 robbers armed with knives boarded the Liberia-flagged bulk carrier Aspasia Luck while underway in the eastbound lane of the Singapore Strait TSS, near position 01:07N 103:30E. After the robbers were spotted in the engine room, the alarm was raised and the crew mustered to search the vessel. The master reported that no perpetrators were found and that engine spare parts had been stolen. All crew members were reported safe and no injuries were reported. (ReCAAP; Clearwater Dynamics; IMB)
- 7. (U) INDONESIA: On 18 October at 0055 local time, five perpetrators armed with knives boarded the Marshall Islands-flagged bulk carrier *Nyon* while underway in the eastbound lane of the Singapore Strait TSS, near position 01:07N 103:29E. After the perpetrators were spotted in the engine room, the alarm was raised and the crew mustered to conduct a

- search. No perpetrators were found and nothing had been stolen. All crew members were reported safe and uninjured. (ReCAAP; Clearwater Dynamics; IMB)
- 8. (U) INDONESIA: On 17 October at 0215 local time, one robber boarded the Singapore-flagged product tanker *BW Kestrel* while anchored at Belawan Anchorage, near position 03:48N 098:44E. A crew member observed a small boat near the anchor chain of the tanker. He attempted to chase off the boat but was unsuccessful. Upon turning around, the crew member encountered a perpetrator armed with a machete. The alarm was raised and the crew mustered. The crew searched the vessel and found that the padlock on the forecastle had been broken. The master reported that ship's properties had been stolen. (ReCAAP; Clearwater Dynamics)
- 9. (U) INDONESIA: On 2 October at 0109 local time, five perpetrators armed with knives boarded the Cook Islands-flagged tanker *Torex* while underway in the eastbound lane of the Singapore Strait TSS, near position 01:04N 103:43E. The crew sighted the robbers boarding at the stern of the tanker and in the engine room. The master raised the alarm and the crew mustered to search the ship. Following the incident, the master reported that the vessel and crew were safe and that engine spare parts had been stolen. The vessel did not require assistance and continued its transit to its next port of call. (ReCAAP)


#### (U) INDIAN SUBCONTINENT

- (U) BANGLADESH: On 13 October at 0148 local time, two robbers boarded the forward deck
  of an anchored bulk carrier in Kutubdia Anchorage, near position 21:48N 091:47E. The
  alarm was raised and the crew mustered to search the vessel. The perpetrators, seeing the
  crew's alertness, escaped in small boats with 10 accomplices. After the search, the crew
  reported ship's stores and crew belongings had been stolen. (IMB; Clearwater Dynamics)

## (U) Appendix B: Definitions

- (U) In order to promote consistent use of accurate terms of reference, we use the following definitions to describe a range of criminal antishipping activity and impediments to safe navigation in our worldwide reporting and analysis.
  - > (U) Attempted Boarding Close approach or hull-to-hull contact with report that boarding paraphernalia were employed or visible in the approaching boat.
  - > (U) Blocking Hampering safe navigation, docking, or undocking of a vessel as a means of protest.
  - > (U) Boarding Unauthorized embarkation of a vessel by persons not part of its complement without successfully taking control of the vessel.
  - > (U) Fired Upon Weapons discharged at or toward a vessel.
  - > (U) Hijacking Unauthorized seizure and retention of a vessel by persons not part of its complement.
  - > (U) Kidnapping Unauthorized forcible removal of persons belonging to the vessel from it.
  - > (U) **Hijacking/Kidnapping Combination** Unauthorized seizure and retention of a vessel by persons not part of its complement who forcefully remove crew members from vessel when disembarking.
  - > (U) Robbery Theft from a vessel or from persons aboard the vessel.
  - > (U) Suspicious Approach All other unexplained activity in close proximity of an unknown vessel.
