JOB SUMMARY

The Kennedy Maritime Analysis Center (KMAC) is looking for an entry-level professional, GG-0132-07/09 FPL 13 to serve as an all-source analyst within the Maritime Activities Department. The Entry Level Intelligence Specialist Position is a developmental position that affords developmental experiences leading to the full performance level. The incumbent will receive on-the-job training in the field of intelligence, by observing, learning and applying various standardized support rules, procedures and/or operations. KMAC analysts are the community leaders in maritime sanctions and counterproliferation, maritime cargo and trade analysis, piracy and maritime crime, port security and infrastructure, the arctic and living marine resource environment, and global commercial vessel activity. KMAC supports the Navy, its partners, and the entire Intelligence Community (IC) on all issues related to the positional data, physical characteristics, and history of more than 100,000 merchant ships operating worldwide. The incumbent will work in a dynamic environment, providing U.S. Navy fleet commanders and national decision makers with in-depth knowledge of the maritime domain and the unique issues associated with it.

Specific Duties

- Performs tasks associated with analyzing or collecting intelligence data.
- Utilizes intelligence principles and methods and established procedures to analyze and evaluate information obtained based on reliability and credibility of source, agreement of source with other sources, and significance of the information.
- Identifies Intelligence gaps, recommends collection requirements to fill gaps, and evaluates the intelligence collected in response to those requirements.
- Attends required naval intelligence analyst training.
- Reviews, on a preliminary basis, analysis or contributions to studies or reports prepared by other government agencies or other elements of own activity to assure conformance and consistency of own analysis to those of others.

Specialized Experience & Minimum Qualifications

Applicants must have directly applicable experience that demonstrates the possession of the knowledge, skills, abilities and competencies necessary for immediate success in the position.
