

ONI / NMIC GENERAL VISITOR INFORMATION AND DIRECTIONS

The Office of Naval Intelligence is one of several tenants of the National Maritime Intelligence Center (NMIC). The NMIC facility is a restricted federal installation, located on the Suitland Federal Center (SFC) campus. The NMIC is not open to the public. All visitors must have a sponsor to coordinate their visit. Visitors must be U.S. citizens without a felony want or warrant and/or a felony conviction within the last 10 years.

The following information pertains to general (non-VIP) visitors. VIP visitors should contact the ONI Protocol office for assistance.

Access to SFC: All visitors to the NMIC must first pass through Suitland Federal Center Gate #5. **Visitors must present a picture ID card at the gate** and should inform the guard that they are visiting ONI. Acceptable picture IDs include:

- Intelligence Community (IC) badges
- Common Access Cards (CACs)
- Military ID cards
- Passports
- State drivers' licenses & similar IDs

Contact your visit sponsor with questions regarding your ID type. **Visitors will be required to stop and obtain a visitor's parking pass** at the SFC guard station before proceeding onto the campus.

Access to NMIC compound: After entering the SFC campus and obtaining a parking pass, visitors should proceed along Swann Road towards the NMIC compound. All visitors with a DoD CAC or Military ID Card will be authorized entry onto the NMIC compound.

Visitors without a DoD CAC or Military ID Card must complete the Department of the Navy Local Population ID Card/Base Access Pass Registration Form (SECNAV 5512/1) and email it to their visit sponsor a minimum of **three business days in advance** of their arrival. Once received, the sponsor will submit a pre-announcement email to the ONI Pass and ID Office for approval. On arrival, the visitor should present a valid photo ID to the NMIC Main Gate (see map); if the SECNAV 5512/1 was approved, the visitor will be granted entry to the compound.

After parking, visitors should proceed to the NMIC Quarterdeck to meet their visit sponsor, check in with the Pass & ID Office, and undergo a security screening.

Leave all electronic devices in vehicles

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Clearance passing: All visitors who have a clearance should have their Security Office submit a Visit Request via JPAS to SMO Code 468043.

Parking: Visitors must obtain a visitor's parking pass at the SFC guard station at SFC Gate #5. After obtaining a pass, visitors may park in any of the Permitted Parking zones on the map on page 3, provided the spot is not reserved or restricted in any way. ***Visitors should leave all electronic devices in their vehicles.***

Note: Parking on the NMIC compound is limited and typically fills before 0800. Visitors who park in lots 1, 3, or the gravel lot may walk along Swann Road to the NMIC Main Gate or use the ONI Shuttle service to gain entry to the NMIC facility.

ONI Shuttle service: The ONI Shuttle is a white bus that stops at several locations on the Suitland Federal Center – see the map on page 3 for stops. It runs M-F, 0530-1830.

Note: The shuttle schedule and stops are subject to change from the information presented here. Contact your visit sponsor for the latest information.

Commercial truck entrance: Commercial Trucks must enter through the Truck Entrance on Suitland Road. Trucks should turn left at Gate #0, located by the Suitland Water Tower. After clearing the security gate, trucks should proceed straight until the NMIC gate is on their right.

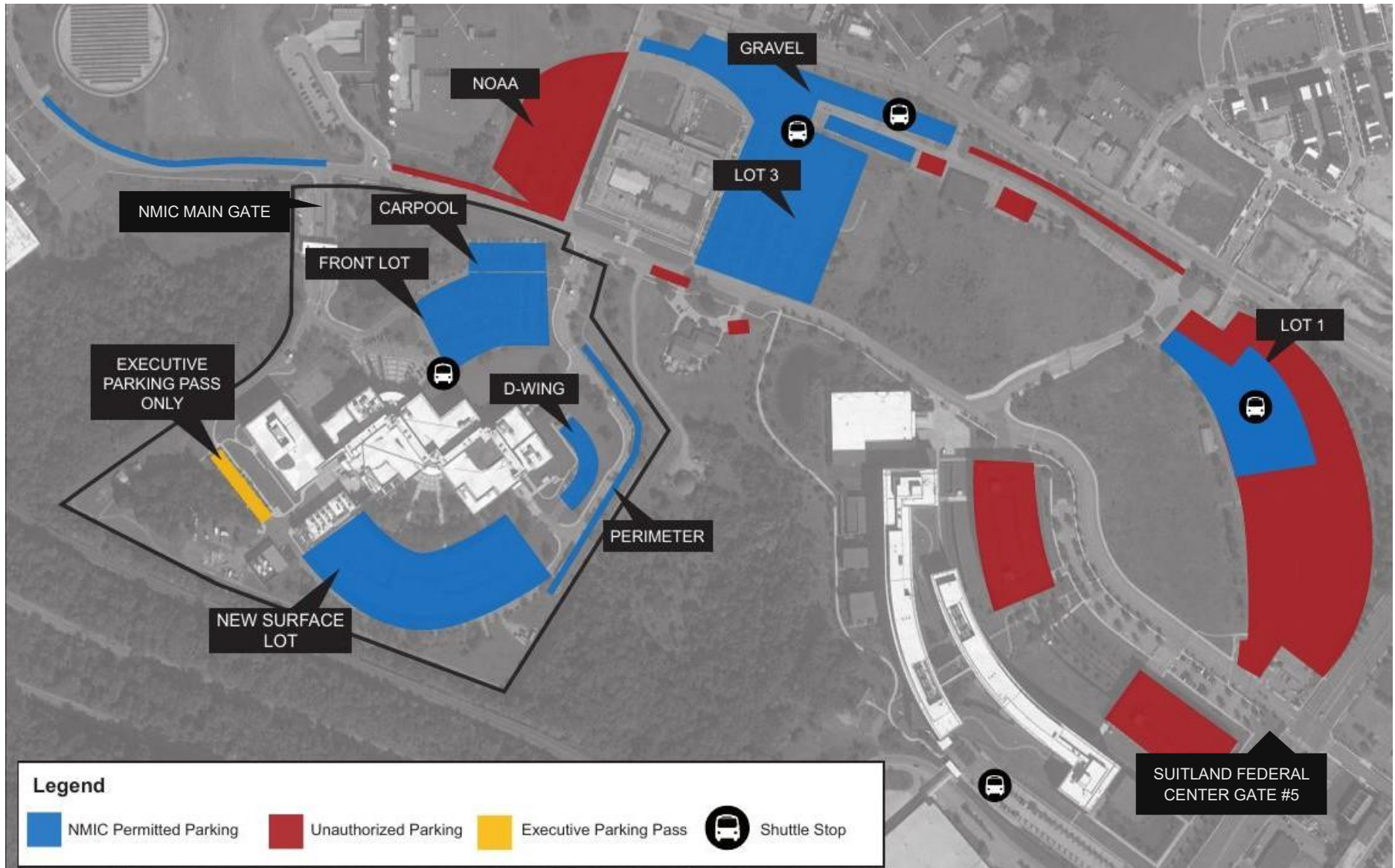
Security procedures: Visitors to both the Suitland Federal Center and/or the NMIC are subject to random inspections as part of the organizations' antiterrorism program. **Vehicles and personnel who enter the NMIC facility are permitted entry conditioned upon consent to be inspected or searched.** Entry and exit inspections are authorized to prevent or deter the unauthorized entry of personnel as well as the prohibited items below.

Prohibited items:
